IDA COUNTY ORDINANCE NO. 21

Title: An ordinance re-adopting the existing county code and amending and/or repealing certain portions therein, Ida County, Iowa.

Be It Enacted by the Board of Supervisors of Ida County, Iowa:

SECTION 1. <u>Purpose</u>. Code of Iowa Section 331.302, subsection nine, requires that once every five years a County shall compile its code of Ordinances. This ordinance readopts ordinances already in effect and amends certain ordinances and repeals any ordinance deemed no longer necessary to the operation of Ida County, Iowa or to the health, safety, and welfare of its citizens.

SECTION 2. Readoption and Amendment of Current Code. The following ordinances, have been previously adopted and enacted into law and were duly published as the law provides. They are stated herein by number and subject matter and by the authority of the Ida County Board of Supervisors comprise Ida County Code of Ordinances:

- G. Commercial-sized Containers" with truck lift devices maybe approved by the County in lieu of conventional cans where suitable.
- P. "Collector" means the person, person, or entity specifically authorized by the Board of Supervisors to collect garbage, rubbish and recyclable materials and to dispose of the same. Rural patrons shall constitute selfcollectors.

SECTION 7: Separation of Yard Waste Required. Beginning January 1, 1991, all yard waste shall be separated by the owner or occupant from all other solid waste accumulated on the premises and maybe composted on the premises or maybe placed in authorized bags, containers or packages and set out for collection by private contractors for yard waste processing or composting.

SECTION 8: Yard Waste Containers. (Deleted)
SECTION 10. Powers and Duties of the Board of
Supervisors. The Board of Supervisors shall have the
authority to set the fees and charges for use of the
designated solid waste facility and shall have the
authority to collect charges for delinquent fees. The
board shall and is authorized to enter into any
necessary contract.

SECTION 11. Powers and Duties of Landfill Manager. (Deleted)

SECTION 12. Powers and Duties of the Landfill

Coordinator. (Deleted)

- SECTION 13: <u>Prohibited Wastes</u>

 A. The following types of waste shall be prohibited from the desinated solid waste facility:
 - 5. Yard Waste
- B. Special waste may be accepted provided a special waste Authorization has been issued by the Iowa Department of Natural Resources. The Board of Supervisors shall establish appropriate charges for special wastes as appropriate for the type of waste and all costs relative to disposal of the special wastes. All assessed costs will be borne by the hauler and/or generator of the special waste.

 - II. Disposition of Recyclables Recyclable materials shall not be placed in the designated solid waste facility on or after July 1, 2001. Persons or entities shall place recyclable materials in county approved containers for collections, or in the alternative, shall deliver recylable materials to the recycling center.
 - A. Definitions-The following terms shall mean:
 - "Collector" means the person, persons or entity specifically authorized by the City Councils and the Board of Supervisors to collect garbage, rubbish and recyclable materials and to dispose of the same. Rural patrons shall constitute selfcollectors.
 - 7. "Paper" means phone books, magazines, catalogs, office paper (white and pastel bond paper, all computer paper, copy machine paper, adding machine papers, telephone message slips, letterhead paper, tablit and not pad paper, fax

paper, newspapers, fill folders), box board containers (cereal boxes, gift boxes, shoe boxes and envelope boxes), junk mail (including window envelopes), and other similar items as determined to be recyclable by the recycling center contractor. If hard covers are removed from books, the books may be recycled.

D. <u>Preparation and Placement of Recyclable Materials for Collection.</u>

- Tires shall be taken to the designated solid waste facility or to an area tire dealer for recycling. A disposal fee will be assessed.
- Motor vehicle batteries and rechargeable household batteries (nickel-cadmium and Mercuric-oxide) sahll be taken to an area recycler, returned to the point of purchase, or taken to the designated solid waste facility.
 - 8. Used oil shall be taken to the designated solid waste facility collection barrel or recycled with an area automotive products retailer.
- IV. Collection by Unauthorized Person
 All collected recyclables are required to go to the
 Ida County Convenience Center for processing.
 This shall not prevent a business for arranging for
 independent collection and processing of its own
 recyclables, generated on its own property,
 provided that the recycled tonnage's are
 periodically reported to the county or
 designated representative.

SECTION 3. Repeal of County Law. The following ordinance deemed by the Board of Supervisors to be of no further value to the operation of Ida County. Failed passage by electors.

SECTION 4. <u>Code of Ordinances</u>. Copies of the code as adopted herein shall be on file and available for public inspection in the office of the County Auditor in the Ida County Courthouse, Ida Grove, Iowa.

SECTION 5. When Effective. This ordinance shall be effective after is final passage, approval and publication as provided by law.
