The Board of Supervisors convened in adjourned session, members present Chair Raymond Drey, Rhett Leonard and Creston Schubert.

A motion was made by Leonard and seconded by Schubert to amend the agenda to include action on a Settlement Participation Form with Janssen Pharmaceuticals. Motion carried, all voting Aye.

Minutes of the meeting held November 9, 2021 were read and approved.

County Engineer, Jeff Williams did not have any formal business, but discussed various road conditions throughout the county.

Quinn Slaven with Summit Carbon Solutions, gave a extensive presentation on what Ida County can expect with the 5-state, 31-partnership of ethanol plants (12 which are located in Iowa) in the state-of-the-art infrasturcture pipeline, where carbon dioxide will be captured and stored deep underground in North Dakota.

Conservation Director, Zach Hall presented the Board with a FY21 review of expenditures/revenues, along with the numerous projects that have been completed. Updates were heard regarding the REAP program and how the community is being reached through FaceBook (1,399 followers) and how the parks are being viewed by the use of Google Data at 32,000.

The Board proceeded to canvass the 2nd Tier of election results for the November 2, 2021 City/School election.
