

NOTICE OF ELECTION

Notice is hereby given to the eligible electors and qualified voters of the County of Ida, State of Iowa, that the Primary Election will be held on Tuesday, June 7, 2022. The polls will open at 7:00AM and close at 8:00PM. Public test of voting equipment was held on May 5, 2022 as published in the County Official Newspapers and Reminder on April 27, 2022.

The decennial census and its corresponding redistricting process re-drew legislative boundaries resulting in several polling location changes within Ida County. Boundaries are established for ten years. Precincts and polling places have changed for many residents. The new precincts went into effect on January 15, 2022 and the first scheduled election using the new precincts is the Primary Election. New voter cards were mailed to active registrants on May 18, 2022. Voters are asked to carefully review their cards and contact the Ida County Auditor's Office for questions regarding polling location information.
